


Trip Details

- Accommodation: Very basic yet comfortable lodging, shared rooms, basic bunk beds and cold showers.
- **Meals:** Daily meals provided, with an emphasis on local cuisine.
- **Transport:** Local transportation between venues and site visits will be arranged.
- **Cultural Orientation:** A briefing on local customs, expectations, and essential Khmer phrases will be provided upon arrival.

Costs & Logistics

- **Cost:** \$1,500 per person. *This includes accommodation, meals, local transport, and guided tours. Flights and visas are NOT <i>included.*
- Flights & Visas: Participants are responsible for booking their flights and obtaining the necessary visa for Cambodia.
- Health & Safety: Ensure you have appropriate vaccinations and travel insurance.
